RIDERS TO WATCH

DID YOU KNOW?

BMX Racing athletes can spin the pedals at up to 220rpm (revolutions per minute) – that's nearly four complete rotations every second!



SAYA SAKIKABARA

The reigning Olympic champion and local favourite. She recently moved back to her hometown on the Gold Coast so she could spend more time on this Brisbane track. Winner of the last three UCI World Cups overall, the rainbow jersey is one thing she'd love to add to her trophy cabinet: the crowd will go wild if No. 77 can get it done.



BETH SCHRIEVER

The defending elite women's champion. Born in East London, she's been the benchmark of global BMX Racing for the best part of a decade. She won gold at the Tokyo 2020 Olympic Games and is a three-time UCI World Champion, winning in 2021, 2023 and 2025. Can anyone beat her in Brisbane?



MOLLY SIMPSON

The next-gen challenger. At age 23, this rider from Red Deer, Alberta is just coming into the peak of her career. She won the opening round of the UCI BMX Racing World Cup last month, showing scary-good form for this week's UCI World Championships.



LAURA SMULDERS

At 33 years old, this legend of Dutch BMX Racing is still at the height of her powers. Last month, she won the European title for the fifth time in her career. There's not much missing from her glittering record, but another UCI World Championship – eight years since her last – would be a crowning achievement.



ZOÉ CLAESSENS

3rd at the Olympic Games, 2nd at the recent European Championships, the 25-year-old is always in the mix. She spent the summer Down Under learning every jump and berm on the Brisbane track, so you know she'll be locked in at these UCI World Championships.

RIDERS TO WATCH



IZAAC KENNEDY

A Gold Coast native, Kennedy has been riding bikes since he was 3 years old at the local Nerang BMX Club. The last time he raced in Brisbane at this level was 2024, when he won a round of the UCI World Cup on his way to taking the overall season victory. A silver medallist at last year's UCI World Championships, he aims to go one better and claim the top step on home soil.



ARTHUR PILARD

To be fair, any member of the formidable French men's squad should be on your radar. We've called out 30-year-old Pilard as the defending champion, but riders like Olympic gold medallist Joris Daudet and bronze medallist Romain Mahieu, European champion Mathis Ragot-Richard, or the in-form Eddy Clerté could all legitimately take the crown.



JAYMIO BRINK

Coming from a storied BMX Racing family, the 22-year-old is ready to write a legacy of his own. He's not always the quickest off the gate, but the canny Dutchman has a knack for nailing all the right lines to reach the front of the pack.



LORIS AEBERHARD

The Swiss champion is mining a rich vein of form, having taking his first and second career UCI World Cup victories back-to-back last month. It's already been a breakthrough season; can #99 pull off the biggest win of all?



DIEGO ARBOLEDA OSPINA

The 30-year-old was on fire at the opening weekend of this year's UCI World Cup in Sarrians, France, where he took his third career win at that level. If he can unlock that kind of magic here in Brisbane, the Colombian could be a chance at the podium.

COMPETING NATIONS

DID YOU KNOW?

The UCI World Champion has the honour of wearing the distinctive rainbow jersey until next year's UCI World Championships. The bands of blue, red, black, yellow and green are the same colours as the Olympic flag, representing Europe, America, Africa, Asia, and Oceania.

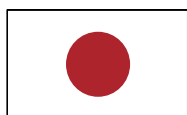
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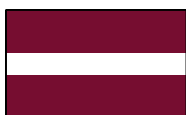
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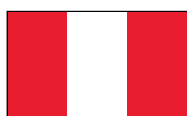
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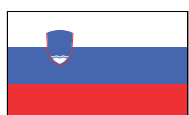
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BEFORE YOU ARRIVE

CHECK OUT THE COMPETITION SCHEDULE

The competition schedule is managed by the UCI and available via the UCI Competition Hub.

PLAN YOUR JOURNEY

There are several ways to get to Sleeman Sports Complex; bus, car, & bike. View detailed options on the page 16, and allow plenty of time for travel, entry, and departure after the event.

ARRIVE EARLY

Don't miss a moment of the action. Spectator gates will open 30 minutes before the beginning of each practice session. Car Parks will open 60 minutes before spectator gates.

REMEMBER YOUR TICKETS!

Ensure you have your device charged with the AXS App loaded. Ticket QR codes will be scanned from your device at the venue entry. QR codes can still be viewed if you don't have Wi-Fi coverage. If you experience difficulties retrieving your tickets, our Box Office staff will be on hand and happy to assist.

AVOID BAGS

It will be much faster to enter the venue. If necessary, make sure your bag will fit under your seat, as there are no cloakrooms. Pram parking bay will be provided on the external concourse of the AMV.

FREE ON THE KNEE

Remember, infants (4 and under) are free in the grandstand provided they don't occupy a seat. If you want a seat for your infant in the grandstand, you need to purchase an additional grandstand ticket – please contact support@axs.com

KEEP IT SIMPLE

You will pass through an airport style screening process as you enter the venue. This is where your tickets will be scanned and your bags will be checked. Restrictions apply to certain items, so please check the Venue Entry Conditions and Prohibited & Restricted Items before you leave home.

PREPARE FOR THE CONDITIONS

Wear comfortable walking shoes and check the weather forecast. Don't forget a hat, sunscreen, or maybe a raincoat or poncho. Umbrellas and camp chairs are not permitted. Spectators have access to Anna Meares Velodrome, meaning there's lots of seating and undercover protection away from the track.

NO SMOKING VENUE

Smoking and Vaping are not permitted anywhere inside the ticketed venue perimeter. A dedicated smoking / vaping area will be established in P2. Spectators will be required to scan out and scan back in using the AXS App.

GUIDE HEARING AND ASSISTANCE DOGS

We welcome all certified assistance animals accompanying patrons to our event. To ensure a safe environment, the animal must be registered with an approved Queensland or Australian assistance dog agency, wear an identifying coat or harness, and the handler must carry a valid identity card for the animal.

REDUCE, REUSE, RECYCLE

With 40,000 spectators expected over 9 days, we need your help to keep rubbish levels low. Spectators and competitors alike are encouraged to bring reusable water bottles and coffee cups to the venue. Free water refill points are available in the venue, and baristas will happily accept your own reusable coffee cup.

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GETTING THERE AND BACK

DID YOU KNOW?

Brisbane last hosted a BMX world championships in 1989. They were held on a dirt track in the centre of the now-demolished Chandler Velodrome, virtually next door to the site of this year's UCI BMX Racing World Championships!

GET ACTIVE

If you're staying locally, walking or cycling may be the easiest way to get to the venue. Bike parking will be available near the Aquatic Centre. Don't forget to bring a bike lock.

TAKE THE BUS

At just 50c per ride (tap your phone or card), public transport is a very affordable way to get to the venue. Bus route 222 will take you from Brisbane city to the Carindale bus interchange, where you can swap to the 250 & 270. Bus routes 250 and 270 can take you to "The Sleeman Centre" stop on Old Cleveland Road. Download the TransLink App (*Apple / Android*) or view the *TransLink website*.

- **Route 222** – Roma Street to Carindale Shopping Centre
- **Route 250** – Redland Bay Marina to Carindale Shopping Centre
- **Route 270** – Victoria Point to Carindale Shopping Centre

TAXI / RIDE SHARE

With a priority drop off and pick up zone just 100m from the venue entry, take the stress out of your journey to the venue by getting dropped off. Load Zone address is 1 Chandler Road (via Gate 1 on Tilley Road).

CATCH THE TRAIN

Depending on where you're staying, travellers on the Brisbane Train Network also benefit from 50c fares. The Cleveland, Beenleigh and Gold Coast train lines offer services in the vicinity of the venue, allowing you to travel part way by train before jumping in a Taxi to or Ride Share Service to the venue. PARK AT THE VENUE

While the Sleeman Sports Complex is a world-class sporting precinct, parking capacity within the venue is limited relative to the scale of the Championships. To ensure a smooth arrival experience and to minimise congestion, parking will be available by pre-booking only.

Parking options include:

- Sleeman Sports Complex (P3) - including accessible car parks, and
- Belmont Shooting Complex (P4)

Pre-booking provides certainty for spectators, allowing customers to secure a parking space in advance while assisting event organisers and venue operators to plan staffing, traffic management, accessibility services and overflow parking requirements.

ACCESSIBLE LOAD ZONE

The accessible load zone is located at 1 Chandler Road (via Gate 1 on Tilley Road), just 100m from the venue entry.

RIDER DROP OFF

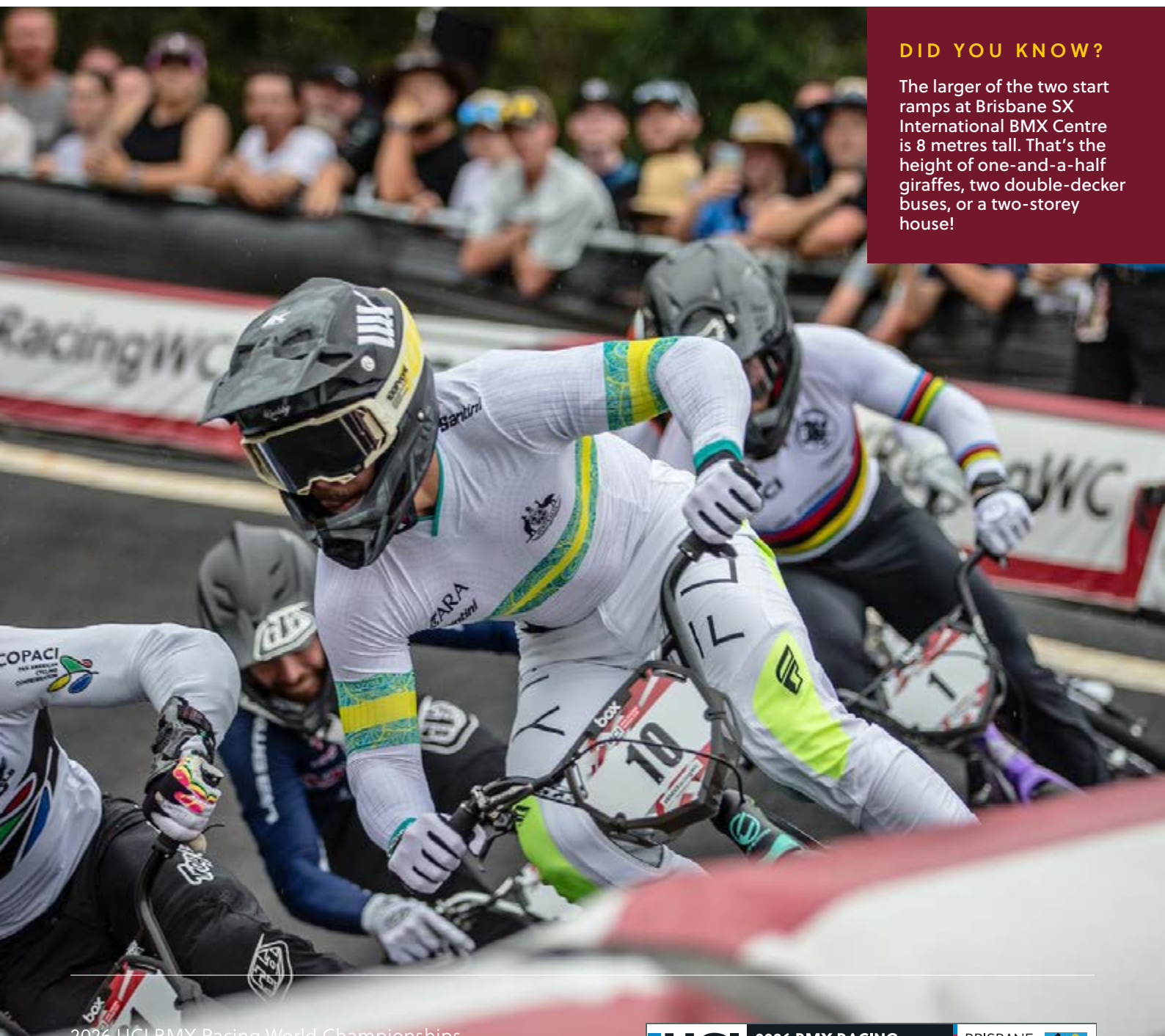
All riders will be issued a "Rider Drop Off / Pick Up" pass to enable drop off close to the dedicated rider entry point (Q3). This is not a parking permit. Drivers must exit the load zone to their pre-planned parking location.

PARK & WALK – STREET PARKING

Street parking is permitted on London Road and Boston Road (both north of Old Cleveland) with a sealed footpath travelling the length of Tilley Road to connect to the Venue. Drivers must obey all traffic and parking signs.

DID YOU KNOW?

The larger of the two start ramps at Brisbane SX International BMX Centre is 8 metres tall. That's the height of one-and-a-half giraffes, two double-decker buses, or a two-storey house!

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KEY VENUE AMENITIES

DID YOU KNOW?

Each race begins with the words, "Okay riders, random start. Riders ready? Watch the gate." After a randomised delay of between 0.1 and 2.7 seconds, the riders hear four beeps and see four lights. The start gate begins to drop on the fourth beep and light.

PARKING & TRANSPORT

- **Bus Routes 250 & 270.** Bus Stop: "The Sleeman Centre" on Old Cleveland Rd. (A6/B10)
- **Taxi Load Zone:** Premium location just 100m from venue entry (L7)
- **Ride Share Load Zone:** Premium location just 100m from venue entry (L7)
- **Accessible Load Zone:** Premium location just 100m from venue entry (L7)
- **Bike Parking:** Adjacent to the Brisbane Aquatic Centre. No bikes in spectator areas. (K6)

VENUE SPECTATOR ENTRY

- Located on the north-west side of the Anna Meares Velodrome (O4)
- AXS Ticket Box Office located adjacent to the spectator entry (N4)

- Inside Anna Meares Velodrome (P5) and outside adjacent to the BMX track (R7)

SPECTATOR SERVICES:

- **Information Booth:** Located near the base of the 5m start ramp.
- **First Aid:** Located near the base of the 5m start ramp.
- **Lost & Found:** Located near the base of the 5m start ramp.

AMENITIES:

- **Food and Beverage:** Variety of catering outlets located inside and outside.
- **Moto'd Bar:** Level 1 - Anna Meares Velodrome with views to the BMX track and Award Ceremonies stage.
- **Hydration:** Free water stations available throughout the venue —please use your own reusable bottle.
- **Toilets:** Various locations inside and outside.
- **Accessible Toilets:** Located on ground floor of Anna Meares Velodrome (R7).
- **Accessible Viewing:** Accessible platform located next to the Start with easy wheelchair access (Q8)
- **Pram Storage:** Anna Meares Velodrome western concourse (P7)
- **Baby Change:** In toilets at the top of stairs, inside Anna Meares Velodrome. (Q7)

RACE VIEWING

- **Ground Pass tickets:** trackside between start hills and Turn 3
- **Grandstand tickets:** trackside along finish straight.
- **Outside Videoboard:** One between Turn 1 and Turn 3, and one at award ceremonies stage
- **Inside Videoboard:** Inside the Anna Meares Velodrome



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
